


## Peace Week

We thought you might like a whistle-stop tour of some of our wonderful Peace Week activities.

### Reception Diamonds

During Peace week we thought about why we celebrate Remembrance Day and made a poster using some Remembrance Day images. We also drew pictures of how we can be peacemakers on raindrops because we want peace to rain down.



### Year 1 Pearls

Year 1 learnt a poem in Peace Week:

I can change the world with my own two hands,  
Make a better place with my own two hands,  
Make a kinder place with my own two hands.

They thought of ways they could use their hands to do this. Here are some of the ideas they wrote.

"I put an ice pack under my friend's arm when he hurt his arm and eye."

"I wrote thank you cards for everyone in Year 1."

"I can change my brother's diaper."

I use my two hands to do jobs at home."

"I can use my hands to sort things out if there is a fight."



### Year 2 Sapphires

This week, Year 2 have made doves to remind us that they are a symbol of the Holy Spirit and of Peace. We have also taken time to compose our own prayers and pray for places in the world experiencing conflict and war. The children came up with very thoughtful and caring ideas which have made beautiful prayers.



Some Year 2 Sapphires chose to spend their break time painting Autumn inspired artwork while listening to some peaceful praise music.



### Year 3 Rubies

During Relationship Time in Year 3 Rubies, we designed and painted wind chimes using the vibrant colours seen in Autumn. Their tinkling sounds in the gentle breeze are very soothing.



During morning break on Wednesday, Years 3 and 4 were invited to enjoy “Painting, Peace and Praise”. We used watercolours to create beautiful patterns, bring landscapes to life and doodle to our hearts’ content, whilst soaking up the wonderful sounds of worship music.




## Year 4 Emeralds

The pupils in 4CR had turns to disrupt the learning taking place in their classroom. They recorded words to describe how their minds felt and displayed them in the cracks of their shattered portraits. The next day, the pupils wrote poems of peace and published these on plasters to mend their broken minds - if you look carefully you might spot personification or even perhaps a metaphor.



Year 4GH celebrated Peace Week by thinking about what peace means to them. They wrote thoughtful poems which reflected our discussions, and considered how constant peace can be when we know God's love. We also made poppies to represent the peace after fighting ceased in 1918.



## Year 5 Topazes

Year 5 had a wonderful time honing their sewing skills making felt poppies for Remembrance Day.

During Peace Week, Year 5 had the opportunity to create their own poppies. The children enjoyed working with a variety of materials, helping each other and spending time thinking about the meaning behind poppies.

Year 5 enjoyed a fascinating talk about the Christian International Peace Service (CHIPS) from Mrs Eady, whose father founded the charity over 50 years ago. We learnt about the different meanings of the word 'peace' and heard about many of the projects the charity has been involved in, both internationally and much closer to home.

We were all inspired to continue our work as peace keepers and even learnt some Ancient Greek!



## Year 6 Aquamarines

During Relationship time throughout Peace Week, Year 6 made felt poppies and decorated inspirational colouring-in sheets on peace along with carefully chosen Bible verses which helped to create an in-depth 'peaceful' experience overall.

A group of Year 5 and 6 children chose to bless our community by painting peace pebbles. They took their time creating beautiful and intricate designs which represented peace to them on a pebble. Once they were dry, they hid them around the common for people to find. In order to avoid any confusion, they wrote a note on the back of the pebble, telling the finder to keep the pebble with love from Dolphin School.
