Coronavirus

There are world-wide concerns following the outbreak of the Coronavirus in China. I thought it would be helpful for you to know the approach we are following at Dolphin.

I have sought advice and as a school, we are following the advice and guidance from Public Health England and the Chief Medical Officer regarding the coronavirus, and looking at daily updates from the Department of Health and Social Care and Public Health England. We know that to date there are no diagnosed cases of coronavirus in the UK. There is advanced monitoring at airports with direct flights from China, and a team of public health experts has been established in Heathrow to support anyone travelling in from China who feels unwell. China has also introduced port-of-exit screening so people already exhibiting symptoms are not allowed to leave the country. I am also choosing directly to contact any of our families known to have been in China, to discuss the situation with them and support them.

In school, we are continuing to be vigilant in reminding all our children about best hygiene, regarding handwashing, coughs and sneezes.

The Chief Medical Officer for England, Professor Chris Whitty, states: "The risk to the UK public remains low", however I am taking a keen interest in developments, and monitoring the situation closely.

Year 4 Emeralds – Royal Academy of Music

Our Year 4 Emeralds shone and sparkled at The Royal Academy of Music Museum on Monday. They were invited to test run a new workshop, designed to explore musical instruments - which linked perfectly to our current inquiry of 'Sound'. Their faces lit up as they were entrusted with handling a century old violin and their hands clapped in delight as they appreciated a personal recital by a 'Master' violinist. As well as all this wonder, our pupils were inspired by a showcase of James Blades' individually designed percussion instruments, to create their own. They were left dazzled by the mechanics found inside a piano, prompting discussion of whether it is an instrument of percussion or string. The debate goes on!
