## Hot Meal Trial

How encouraging that many parents are already expressing interest in the hot meal trial. Understandably, there have been some additional queries, which I will try to address here, so that everyone has the benefit of the information.

During the trial from Monday 27 April to Friday 15 May the options are a vegetarian, vegan or meat/fish option, following the menu that was sent out. Most other dietary requirements can be accommodated. A further form will be sent out once you have signed your child up for the hot lunches, where you can inform Kidz co. of any allergies or dietary requirements your child may have.

The trial is for the full three weeks and there is no option to select just certain days.

The Senior Team had a tasting session before we opted to launch a trial of Kidz Co. lunches. After the trial, we will take feedback and review the experience.

The meals conform to the early years and school food trust guidelines. The food is not organic but Kidz Co. ensures a recommended nutritional balance. The meat is not reconstituted but is all free range.
