


Year 4 Emeralds

- A clear voice which can be heard
- Expression
- Movement or Gesture
- Varying pace
- Clear understanding of the meaning of the poem
- Confidence
- Eye contact with the audience
- Following the rhythm where needed
- Engaging the audience in the performance
- Use of extra touches to make it memorable and entertaining

Nasal Flu Vaccination

This year, nasal flu vaccinations are being offered by the NHS to all pupils from Reception to Year 6 on **Monday 9 November** at Dolphin School. Whether or not you wish your child to be immunised at school, you are requested still to complete the form which will be sent home with your child tomorrow. Then, please return the form to school in the envelope provided by **Friday 2 October**. Collection boxes for these forms will be at each entrance every morning next week.

If your child routinely receives a flu spray/injection annually at your GP, they should continue to do so and therefore do not need to have the nasal flu vaccination in school.

Please would you make sure that you notify the school, on the day, if your child is unwell and you do not wish your child to be immunised.

If your child is asthmatic you will need to notify the school on the morning of 9 November if there has been a change to their regular medication, or if they have been wheezy within the last 72 hours.

Please note that nurses will be wearing PPE which includes facemasks and visors, as well as their uniform, when they visit school on Monday 9 November to administer the nasal flu vaccinations.
