

Main Responsibilities

Teaching & Curriculum

- Plan and deliver creative and inspiring lessons in line with the Dolphin School curriculum and schemes of work
- Prepare and upload termly, weekly, and daily planning to the school's shared system
- Set meaningful homework tasks in line with individual targets and developmental needs
- Administer and record assessments and tests as appropriate for the year group
- Track and report on pupil progress through written and verbal feedback and formal reports
- Work closely with the SENCo and Senior Team to support individual learning needs
